Day 01	<p><b>Haned/Narita Airport-Imperial Palace Plaza-National Diet Building-The Tokyo tower-Ginza (Lunch/Dinner)</b></p> <p>Haneda/Narita Airport - Upon arrival you will meet with our representative</p> <p><b>Imperial Palace Plaza</b>-The current Imperial Palace is located on the former site of Edo Castle, a large park area surrounded by moats and massive stone walls in the center of Tokyo, a short walk from Tokyo Station. It is the residence of Japan's Imperial Family.*<b>National Diet Building</b>-The Japanese parliament is called the Diet. It consists of the House of Representatives (480 members) and the House of Councillors (242 members). The members of the Diet are elected by the Japanese people.</p> <p><b>National Diet Building</b>-The Japanese parliament is called the Diet. The members of the Diet are elected by the Japanese people.</p> <p><b>The Tokyo Tower</b>-With 333 meters, Tokyo Tower is 13 meters taller than its model, the Eiffel Tower of Paris, and the world's tallest self-supporting steel tower. It was completed in the year 1958 as a symbol for Japan's rebirth as a major economic power, and serves as a television and radio broadcast antenna and tourist attraction.</p> <p><b>Ginza</b>-The Ginza is Tokyo's most famous upmarket shopping, dining and entertainment district, featuring numerous department stores, boutiques, art galleries, restaurants, night clubs and cafes.</p> <p><b>Asakusa Sight Seeing</b>-Asakusa is the center of Tokyo's shitamachi (literally "low city"), one of Tokyo's districts, where an atmosphere of the Tokyo of past decades survives. Asakusa's main attraction is Sensoji, a very popular Buddhist temple.</p>
Day 02	<p><b>Tokyo-Kamakura-Hakone-Owakudani-Kawaguchiko (Breakfast/Lunch/Diner)</b></p> <p>Sightseeing in Kamakura</p> <p><b>The Great Budha:</b> The Great Buddha of Kamakura (Kamakura Daibutsu) is a bronze statue of Amida Buddha, which stands on the grounds of Kotokuin Temple. With a height of 13.35 meters, it is the second tallest bronze Buddha statue in Japan, surpassed only by the statue in Nara's Todaiji Temple.</p> <p><b>Hakone:</b> Hakone is part of the Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park, less than 100 kilometers from Tokyo. Famous for hot springs,outdoor activities, natural beauty and the view of nearby Mt. Fuji, Hakone is one of the most popular destinationsamong Japanese and international tourists looking for a break from Tokyo.</p> <p><b>Owakudani</b>- Owakudani is the area around a crater created during the last eruption of Mount Hakone some 3000 years ago. Today, much of the area is an active volcanic zone where sulfurous fumes, hot springs and hot rivers can be experienced. Additionally, Owakudani has good views of Mount Fuji on clear days.</p>

Day 03	<p><b>Kawaguchiko--Fujisan-Yokohama-Chinatown</b> <span style="float: right;"><b>(Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)</b></span></p> <p><b>Mt.FUJI</b>-Mount Fuji (Fujisan) is with 3776 meters Japan's highest mountain. It is not surprising that the nearly perfectly shaped volcano has been worshipped as a sacred mountain and experienced big popularity among artists and common people.</p> <p><b>Yokohama:</b> With a population of over three million people is Yokohama Japan's second largest city. Yokohama is located less than half an hour south of Tokyo by train, and is the capital of Kanagawa Prefecture.</p> <p><b>Chinatown :</b> Yokohama Chinatown is Japan's largest chinatown, located in central Yokohama.Yokohama Chinatown quickly developed, after the port of Yokohama had been one of the first Japanese ports to be opened to foreign trade in 1859. It became the residence of the many Chinese traders who settled down in the city.</p>
Day 04	<p><b>Tokyo-Kegonno Taki Waterfall-Nikko Toshogu Shrine- Lake chuzenji- Tokyo</b> <span style="float: right;"><b>(Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)</b></span></p> <p><b>KegonnoTaki Waterfall</b>-The almost 100 meter tall Kego Waterfall (Kego no taki) is the most famous of Nikko's many beautiful waterfalls. In fact, it is even ranked as one of Japan's three most beautiful falls, along with Nachi Waterfall in Wakayama Pref</p> <p><b>Nikko Toshogu Shrine</b>-The Toshogu is the mausoleum of Tokugawa Ieyasu, founder of the Tokugawa shogunate, which ruled Japan for over 250 years until 1868. The shrine is dedicated to the spirits of Ieyasu and two other of Japan's most influential historic</p> <p><b>Lake Chuzenji</b>-Lake Chuzenji (Chuzenjiko) is a scenic lake in the mountains above the town of Nikko. It is located at the foot of Mount Nantai, Nikko's sacred volcano, whose eruption blocked the valley below, thereby creating Lake Chuzenji about 20,000 years ago.</p>
Day 05	<p><b>Asakusa -Shinjuku-Shibuya</b> <span style="float: right;"><b>(Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)</b></span></p> <p><b>Asakusa Sight Seeing</b>-Asakusa is the center of Tokyo's shitamachi (literally "low city"), one of Tokyo's districts, where an atmosphere of the Tokyo of past decades survives. Asakusa's main attraction is Sensoji, a very popular Buddhist temple.</p> <p><b>Shinjuku</b>-Shinjuku is one of the 23 city wards of Tokyo, but the name commonly refers to just the large entertainment, business and shopping area around Shinjuku Station. Shinjuku Station is the world's busiest railway station, handling more than two million customer everyday.</p> <p><b>Shibuya</b>-Shibuya is one of the twenty-three city wards of Tokyo, but often refers to just the popular shopping and entertainment area found around Shibuya Station. In this regard, Shibuya is one of Tokyo's most colorful and busy districts.</p>
