Day 01	Arrival transfer to hotel	

<p>Day 02</p>	<p>Kansai – Den Den Town – Osaka Castle – Shinsaibashi - Doudonbori (Breakfast,Lunch,Dinner)</p> <p>Upon arrival you will meet with our representative</p> <p>Den Den Town-Located in the Nipponbashi area, Den Den Town is an electronics district comparable to Tokyo's Akihabara, and you may be able to bargain to a better deal. Den Den Town is becoming known as an otaku paradise with numerous manga and anime retailers as well as maid and cosplay cafes located there.</p> <p>Osaka Castle - The construction of Osaka Castle started in 1583 on the former site of the Ishiyama Honganji Temple, which had been destroyed by Oda Nobunaga thirteen years earlier. Toyotomi Hideyoshi intended the castle to become the center of a new, unified Japan under Toyotomi rule. It was the largest castle at the time.</p> <p>Shinsaibashi Shopping area- In between Umeda and Namba is the covered shopping arcade Shinsaibashi Suji, one of Osaka's oldest and busiest shopping destinations which RUNS about 600 meters in length. Shinsaibashi Suji's collection of brand name shops, chain stores, independent boutiques and variety of restaurants makes it popular with nearly every kind of shopper. At Dotombori, Shinsaibashi Suji becomes Ebisubashi Suji, though the same shopping atmosphere remains.</p> <p>Doudonbori - One of Osaka's most popular tourist destinations, this street runs parallel to the Dotonbori canal. It is a popular SHOPPING and entertainment district and is also known as a food destination. At night it is lit by hundreds of neon lights and mechanized signs, including the famous Glico Running Man sign and Kani Doraku crab sign.</p>
<p>Day 03</p>	<p>Osaka – Nara Deer Park – Todaiji Temple – Kyoto – Kiyomizu Temple – Kimono Show -Nagoya (Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)</p> <p>Deer Park (Nara) -Nara Park is a large park in central Nara. Established in 1880, it is the location of many of Nara's main attractions including Todaiji, Kasuga Taisha, Kofukuji and the Nara National Museum.</p> <p>Todaiji Temple -Todaiji is one of Japan's most famous and historically significant temples and a landmark of Nara. The temple was constructed in 752 as the head temple of all provincial Buddhist temples of Japan and grew so powerful that the capital was moved from Nara to Nagaoka in 784 in ORDER to lower the temple's influence on government affairs.</p> <p>Kiyomizu Temple -Kiyomizudera (Pure Water Temple) is one of the most celebrated temples of Japan. It was founded in 780 on the site of the Otowa Waterfall in the wooded hills east of Kyoto, and derives its name from the fall's pure waters. The temple was originally associated with the Hosso sect, one of the oldest schools within Japanese Buddhism, but formed its own Kita Hosso sect in 1965. In 1994, the temple was added to the list of UNESCO world heritage sites.</p> <p>Kimono Show(Kyoto) -The Nishijin district in Kyoto, famous for traditional weaving, continues to stage kimono fashion shows in an effort to attract foreign tourists and rejuvenate the industry. Since 1956, the Nishijin Textile Center in the ancient capital's Kamigyō Ward has organized some 140,000 shows, attracting an estimated 14 million spectators.</p>
<p>Day 04</p>	<p>Nagoya – Mt Fuji – Gotenba Premium Outlet – Lake – Kawaguchi (Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)</p> <p>Mount Fuji -Mount Fuji is with 3776 meters Japan's highest mountain. It is not surprising that the nearly perfectly shaped volcano has been worshiped as a sacred mountain and experienced big popularity among artists and common people throughout the centuries. Mount Fuji is an ACTIVE volcano, which most recently erupted in 1708. It stands on the border between Yamanashi and Shizuoka Prefectures and can be seen from Tokyo and Yokohama on clear days.</p>

	<p>Lake Kawaguchi - Lake Kawaguchiko is the most easily accessible of the Fuji Five Lakes with train and direct bus connections to Tokyo. A hot spring resort town with various tourist attractions and views of Mount Fuji is located around the lake's eastern end, while the northern and western shores are mostly undeveloped.</p> <p>The best views of Mount Fuji can be enjoyed from the lake's northern shores and are particularly breathtaking during the cherry blossom season around mid April and the autumn colors around the first half of November. One of the nicest spots for cherry blossoms is the seaside promenade near the Kawaguchiko Music Forest, while photographers will enjoy the "Momiji Tunnel" for autumn colors, a maple tree covered road section along the lake's northern shore.</p> <p>Gotemba Premium Outlet - The Gotemba Premium Outlets are Japan's most popular outlet mall, located in Gotemba City at the base of Mount Fuji, not far from Hakone. The mall features over 200 STORES along with a number of restaurants, a food court and a 50 meter high ferris wheel.</p>
<p>Day 05</p>	<p>Kawaguchi – Hananomiyako Flower Field – Oshino Hakkao 8 Ponds – Tokyo – Asakusa Temple – Nakamise Street – Tokyo Sky Tree(Photo stop) – Shinjuku - (Breakfast/Lunch)</p> <p>Hananomiyako Flower Park- Yamanakako Hanano Miyako Koen, located at the area of Lake Yamanakako, the nearest lake to Mt. Fuji, is a flower park in the highland 1,000m above sea level where you can enjoy various kinds of flowers from spring to autumn. “Seiryu-no-sato HOMEof spring water)” in the park has the Myojin waterfall, a GREENHOUSE dome, and an exhibition site of lava of Mt. Fuji.</p> <p>Oshino Hakkai 8 ponds - Oshino Hakkai is a touristy set of eight ponds in Oshino, a small village in the Fuji Five Lake region, located between Lake Kawaguchiko and Lake Yamanakako on the site of a former sixth lake that dried out several hundred years ago. The eight ponds are fed by snow melt from the slopes of nearby Mount Fuji that filters down the mountain through porous layers of lava for over 80 years, resulting in very clear spring water that is revered by the locals.</p> <p>Asakusa Kannon Temple - Sensōji, also known as Asakusa Kannon Temple) is a Buddhist temple located in Asakusa. It is one of Tokyo's most colorful and popular temples. The legend says that in the year 628, two brothers fished a statue of Kannon, the goddess of mercy, out of the Sumida River, and even though they put the statue back into the river, it always returned to them. Consequently, Sensoji was built nearby for the goddess of Kannon. The temple was completed in 645, making it Tokyo's oldest temple.</p> <p>Nakamise Arcade - Asakusa is the center of Tokyo's shitamachi (literally "low city"), one of Tokyo's districts, where an atmosphere of the Tokyo of past decades survives.</p> <p>Asakusa's main attraction is Sensoji, a very popular Buddhist temple, built in the 7th century. The temple is approached via the Nakamise, a SHOPPING street that has been providing temple visitors with a variety of traditional, local snacks and tourist souvenirs for centuries.</p> <p>Shinjuku- Shinjuku is one of the 23 city wards of Tokyo, but the name commonly refers to just the large entertainment, business and shopping area around Shinjuku Station.</p> <p>Shinjuku Station is the world's busiest railway station, handling more than two million passengers every day. It is served by about a dozen railway and subway lines, including the JR Yamanote Line. Shinjuku is also one of Tokyo's major stops for long-distance highway buses and city buses.</p>
