| Day 01 | <p>Haneda/Narita Airport-Imperial Palace Plaza-National Diet Building-The Tokyo tower-Asakusa Kannon Temple-Nakamise Arcade-Shinjuku (Lunch/Dinner)</p> <p>Haneda/Narita Airport - Upon arrival you will meet with our representative</p> <p>Imperial Palace Plaza-The current Imperial Palace is located on the former site of Edo Castle, a large park area surrounded by moats and massive stone walls in the center of Tokyo, a short walk from Tokyo Station. It is the residence of Japan's Imperial Family.*National Diet Building-The Japanese parliament is called the Diet. It consists of the House of Representatives (480 members) and the House of Councillors (242 members). The members of the Diet are elected by the Japanese people.</p> <p>National Diet Building-The Japanese parliament is called the Diet. It consists of the House of Representatives (480 members) and the House of Councillors (242 members). The members of the Diet are elected by the Japanese people.</p> <p>The Tokyo Tower- With 333 meters, Tokyo Tower is 13 meters taller than its model, the Eiffel Tower of Paris, and the world's tallest self-supporting steel tower. It was completed in the year 1958 as a symbol for Japan's rebirth as a major economic power, and serves as a television and radio broadcast antenna and tourist attraction.</p> <p>Asakusa Kannon Temple - Sensōji, also known as Asakusa Kannon Temple) is a Buddhist temple located in Asakusa. It is one of Tokyo's most colorful and popular temples. The legend says that in the year 628, two brothers fished a statue of Kannon, the goddess of mercy, out of the Sumida River, and even though they put the statue back into the river, it always returned to them. Consequently, Sensoji was built nearby for the goddess of Kannon. The temple was completed in 645, making it Tokyo's oldest temple.</p> <p>Nakamise Arcade - Asakusa is the center of Tokyo's shitamachi (literally "low city"), one of Tokyo's districts, where an atmosphere of the Tokyo of past decades survives.</p> <p>Asakusa's main attraction is Sensoji, a very popular Buddhist temple, built in the 7th century. The temple is approached via the Nakamise, a SHOPPING street that has been providing temple visitors with a variety of traditional, local snacks and tourist souvenirs for centuries.</p> <p>Shinjuku- Shinjuku is one of the 23 city wards of Tokyo, but the name commonly refers to just the large entertainment, business and shopping area around Shinjuku Station.</p> <p>Shinjuku Station is the world's busiest railway station, handling more than two million passengers every day. It is served by about a dozen railway and subway lines, including the JR Yamanote Line. Shinjuku is also one of Tokyo's major stops for long-distance highway buses and city buses.</p> |
| Day 02 | <p>Tokyo-Kamakura-Hakone-Owakudani-Kawaguchiko (Breakfast/Lunch/Diner)</p> <p>Sightseeing in Kamakura</p> <p>The Great Budha: The Great Buddha of Kamakura (Kamakura Daibutsu) is a bronze statue of Amida Buddha, which stands on the grounds of Kotokuin Temple. With a height of 13.35 meters, it is the second tallest bronze Buddha statue in Japan, surpassed only by the statue in Nara's Todaiji Temple.</p> <p>Hakone: Hakone is part of the Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park, less than 100 kilometers from Tokyo. Famous for hot springs,outdoor activities, natural beauty and the view of nearby Mt. Fuji, Hakone is one of the most popular destinationsamong Japanese and international tourists looking for a break from Tokyo.</p> <p>Hakone Ropeway-Blessed by its wonderful natural environment, superb scenery and an abundance of natural hot springs, Hakone is one of the leading tourist attractions in Japan. The Hakone Ropeway service operates at approximately one-minute intervals, and the 30-minute journey from Sounzan Station to Togendai Station, which nestles on the shore of Lake Ashi, allows visitors to take in such spectacular views</p> |

We are sure that you will enjoy your stroll in the sky, as you find yourself surrounded by some of the most famous sights that Japan has to offer.</p> <p>Owakudani- Owakudani is the area around a crater created during the last eruption of Mount Hakone some 3000 years ago. Today, much of the area is an active volcanic zone where sulfurous fumes, hot springs and hot rivers can be experienced. Additionally, Owakudani has good views of Mount Fuji on clear days.</p> |
| <p>Day 03</p> | <p>Kawaguchiko-Mount Fuji-Lake Kawaguchi -Hananomiyako Flower Park-Oshino Hakkai 8 ponds-Tokyo</p> <p style="text-align: right;">(Breakfast/Lunch)</p> <p>Mount Fuji -Mount Fuji is with 3776 meters Japan's highest mountain. It is not surprising that the nearly perfectly shaped volcano has been worshiped as a sacred mountain and experienced big popularity among artists and common people throughout the centuries.</p> <p>Mount Fuji is an ACTIVE volcano, which most recently erupted in 1708. It stands on the border between Yamanashi and Shizuoka Prefectures and can be seen from Tokyo and Yokohama on clear days.</p> <p>Lake Kawaguchi - Lake Kawaguchiko is the most easily accessible of the Fuji Five Lakes with train and direct bus connections to Tokyo. A hot spring resort town with various tourist attractions and views of Mount Fuji is located around the lake's eastern end, while the northern and western shores are mostly undeveloped.</p> <p>The best views of Mount Fuji can be enjoyed from the lake's northern shores and are particularly breathtaking during the cherry blossom season around mid April and the autumn colors around the first half of November. One of the nicest spots for cherry blossoms is the seaside promenade near the Kawaguchiko Music Forest, while photographers will enjoy the "Momiji Tunnel" for autumn colors, a maple tree covered road section along the lake's northern shore.</p> <p>Hananomiyako Flower Park- Yamanakako Hanano Miyako Koen, located at the area of Lake Yamanakako, the nearest lake to Mt. Fuji, is a flower park in the highland 1,000m above sea level where you can enjoy various kinds of flowers from spring to autumn. "Seiryu-no-sato HOME of spring water)" in the park has the Myojin waterfall, a GREENHOUSE dome, and an exhibition site of lava of Mt. Fuji.</p> <p>Oshino Hakkai 8 ponds - Oshino Hakkai is a touristy set of eight ponds in Oshino, a small village in the Fuji Five Lake region, located between Lake Kawaguchiko and Lake Yamanakako on the site of a former sixth lake that dried out several hundred years ago. The eight ponds are fed by snow melt from the slopes of nearby Mount Fuji that filters down the mountain through porous layers of lava for over 80 years, resulting in very clear spring water that is revered by the locals.</p> |
| <p>Day 04</p> | <p>Tokyo-Kegonno Taki Waterfall-Nikko Toshogu Shrine- Lake chuzenji- Tokyo</p> <p style="text-align: right;">(Breakfast/Lunch)</p> <p>KegonnoTaki Waterfall-The almost 100 meter tall Kegon Waterfall (Kegon no taki) is the most famous of Nikko's many beautiful waterfalls. In fact, it is even ranked as one of Japan's three most beautiful falls, along with Nachi Waterfall in Wakayama Pref</p> <p>Nikko Toshogu Shrine-The Toshogu is the mausoleum of Tokugawa Ieyasu, founder of the Tokugawa shogunate, which ruled Japan for over 250 years until 1868. The shrine is dedicated to the spirits of Ieyasu and two other of Japan's most influential historic.</p> <p>Lake Chuzenji-Lake Chuzenji (Chuzenjiko) is a scenic lake in the mountains above the town of Nikko. It is located at the foot of Mount Nantai, Nikko's sacred volcano, whose eruption blocked the valley below, thereby creating Lake Chuzenji about 20,000 Year ago.</p> |
