<p>Day 02</p>	<p>Haneda/Narita Airport-Imperial Palace Plaza-National Diet Building-The Tokyo tower-Asakusa Kannon Temple (Lunch/Dinner)</p> <p>Haneda/Narita Airport - Upon arrival you will meet with our representative</p> <p>Imperial Palace Plaza-The current Imperial Palace is located on the former site of Edo Castle, a large park area in Tokyo, a short walk from Tokyo Station. It is the residence of Japan's Imperial Family.*National Diet Building-The National Diet Building is the seat of the Japanese government. It houses the House of Representatives (480 members) and the House of Councillors (242 members). The members of the Diet are elected by the Japanese people.</p> <p>National Diet Building-The Japanese parliament is called the Diet. It consists of the House of Representatives and the House of Councillors. The members of the Diet are elected by the Japanese people.</p> <p>The Tokyo Tower- With 333 meters, Tokyo Tower is 13 meters taller than its model, the Eiffel Tower of Paris, and was built in the year 1958 as a symbol for Japan's rebirth as a major economic power, and serves as a television and radio tower.</p> <p>Asakusa Kannon Temple - Sensōji, also known as Asakusa Kannon Temple) is a Buddhist temple located in Asakusa, Tokyo. The legend says that in the year 628, two brothers fished a statue of Kannon, the goddess of mercy, out of the Sagami River, it always returned to them. Consequently, Sensoji was built nearby for the goddess of Kannon. The temple is one of the most popular in Tokyo.</p> <p>Nakamise Arcade - Asakusa is the center of Tokyo's shitamachi (literally "low city"), one of Tokyo's districts, where you can find traditional shops and street food. Asakusa's main attraction is Sensoji, a very popular Buddhist temple, built in the 7th century. The temple is approached by a long staircase, providing temple visitors with a variety of traditional, local snacks and tourist souvenirs for centuries.</p> <p>Shinjuku- Shinjuku is one of the 23 city wards of Tokyo, but the name commonly refers to just the large entertainment area around Shinjuku Station.</p> <p>Shinjuku Station is the world's busiest railway station, handling more than two million passengers every day. It is served by the JR Yamanote Line. Shinjuku is also one of Tokyo's major stops for long-distance highway buses and city buses.</p>
<p>Day 03</p>	<p>Tokyo-Kamakura-Hakone-Owakudani-Kawaguchiko (Breakfast/Lunch/Diner)</p> <p>Sightseeing in Kamakura</p> <p>The Great Buddha: The Great Buddha of Kamakura (Kamakura Daibutsu) is a bronze statue of Amida Buddha, standing 13.35 meters, it is the second tallest bronze Buddha statue in Japan, surpassed only by the statue in Nara's Todaiji Temple.</p> <p>Hakone: Hakone is part of the Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park, less than 100 kilometers from Tokyo. Famous for its hot springs, nearby Mt. Fuji, Hakone is one of the most popular destinations among Japanese and international tourists looking for a relaxing getaway.</p> <p>Hakone Ropeway-Blessed by its wonderful natural environment, superb scenery and an abundance of natural hot springs, the Hakone Ropeway service operates at approximately one-minute intervals, and the 30-minute journey from the shore of Lake Ashi, allows visitors to take in such spectacular views as the crystal-clear blue waters of Lake Ashi and Mount Fuji on a fine, sunny day. We are sure that you will enjoy your stroll in the sky, as you find yourself surrounded by nature.</p> <p>Owakudani- Owakudani is the area around a crater created during the last eruption of Mount Hakone some 300 years ago. Here, where sulfurous fumes, hot springs and hot rivers can be experienced. Additionally, Owakudani has good views of Mount Fuji.</p>

It is not surprising that the nearly perfect mountain has experienced big popularity among artists and common people throughout the centuries. Mount Fuji is an ACTIVE volcano, which most recently erupted in 1708. It stands on the border between Yamanashi and Shizuoka Prefecture. On clear days, you can see the sea from the top of the mountain.</p>

It is located in a valley that was once blocked by a volcanic eruption, thereby creating Lake Chuzenji about 20,000 Year ago.</p>
